Select **one** of the projects below to demonstrate in a creative manner your understanding of an ocean animal or plant. The project is to show a creation made by the student, and this assignment will be **graded based on the student's creativity**. Projects will be graded based on spelling, grammar, punctuation, effort, organization, creativity, and originality. **All projects are due Thursday, August 13, 2026. Please be ready to present your project on Thursday, August 13, 2026, to your new class. No late projects will be accepted!**

**Computer Projects-** It is your responsibility to save your project on a jump drive or on your OneDrive folder in Office 365 via your student portal. You must bring the **jump drive and a printed copy** of your project to class on the due date.

<p>Create a <b><u>magazine cover</u></b> page using one of these titles: Sea Animal of the Year, Ocean Plant of the Year Include the following: the name of the animal/plant that won the award, a diagram with at least 4 labels, a phrase or slogan that outlines the importance of this item, and headings that describe the reasons why they won the award of the year. Decorate the cover. The magazine cover page must be the size of a sheet of paper (8 ½ X 11) or done on <b><u>one</u></b> PowerPoint slide/or Canva.</p>	<p>A <b><u>PowerPoint or Canva Slideshow</u></b> of at least 6 slides using text, color, graphics, and animation that describes one of the following: an ocean animal or sea plant/algae. Slides must include: name, picture, and caption, explain its significance, plus one additional fun fact, and one image or gif that illustrates the most innovative illustration/image of this animal/plant/algae. Create a title slide with your name, date, and image you would like to share that enhances your presentation. Each slide is to contain fewer than 15 words per slide.</p>
<p>Use recycled materials found at home to <b><u>create a small 3D model</u></b> of a unique ocean vehicle. Write on an index card the following: name, description, role it plays in the environment, and include a slogan that describes the unique characteristics. Glue the index card to your small 3D model. The model can be up to 12 X 12.</p>	<p>Create an <b><u>Instagram poster</u></b> to tell about a sea animal, plant, algae, or vehicle. The poster must look like an Instagram page with a profile picture. You must include a summary that details special characteristics of this item, a website that is related, pictures that best detail unique attributes, and captions that describe the pictures. You can create this Instagram poster on PowerPoint, Canva, Stop Motion, or use a 12 X 12 scrapbook paper.</p>

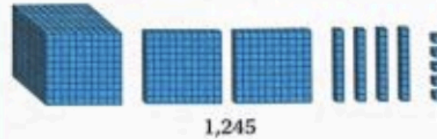
