

# **Summer Reading Activities for Future Third Graders**

Miami Reads (dadeschools.net)

- 1. Select two books (informational & literary) to read that are at your reading level.
- 2. Choose one activity to complete for each book.
- 3. Be creative with the materials you will use as: markers, paints, construction paper, craft supplies, recycled items, etc.
- 4. You can use your own drawings, clip art, or internet pictures. Any hand-drawn illustrations should always be completed in color.
- 5. Spelling and grammar count on all projects!
- 6. You can print or type your project, BUT all information should be written in your own words. NO PLAGIARISM
- 7. All book projects must be dated, measure  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ , contain the title of the book. and author's name.





# How to Login


The i-Ready icon can be found on the student's Clever portal, under the section titled "Summer eLearning Toolbox."

For each IXL skill, your child should work to a SmartScore of 80, which is considered proficiency. This assures that they have a really good grasp on the skill.


If your child achieves proficiency and is ready for a challenge, they can always strive for mastery-a SmartScore of 100!




# Track your child's progress
