- 7. All book projects must be dated, measure  $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ , contain the title of the book and author's name.



Write a poem about the idea, topic, or information presented in your book.	Create a collage around central idea or theme in the book. For example: friendship, courage, family, etc. Write a half page description of the central idea or theme presented in the collage.

Make a poster 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 advertising your book so someone else will want to read it. Write a half page explanation why someone will want to read it.	You are the reporter. Write a front-page news story or a report live from the scene.

  - Select Reflex via Schoology.
  - Students will be taken directly into their accounts. No username or password required.
- Students are encouraged to login to Reflex math through their student portal at least 3 times a week and strive for the "green light" each time. Importance of the Green Light Info
- Your child can utilize the Raflex math program from any device with internet access throughout the summer, including smartphones.
- Reflex helps students of all ability levels to develop fluency with their basic facts in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Reflex continuously monitors your child's performance to create an optimal experience for them.


